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[ **Abstract** ] David Tracy is a well-known contemporary Catholic theologian. *Plurality and Ambiguity: Hermeneutics, Religion and Hope* is a small book he wrote in mid-career with dialogue as its main theme. In the book, Tracy's clear and incisive pen discusses hermeneutics, which interprets the principle of the interpretation. He analyzes and reflects on the high degree of ambiguity in language and the high degree of pluralism in history. He explores the ways to recover meaning and truth in the postmodern world, and concludes that the best forms of religion can provide the power needed to bring hope. This paper summarizes and comments on Tracy's book to help readers grasp the logic and essence of his thinking more efficiently.

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
